

KRCT clients during 2006-2008

Mimoza SALIHU 15-30.01.2009 In 2004 using Microsoft Access KRCT has developed a valuable Client Tracking database that contains information on methods of torture, time and, place where torture occurred and the impact of torture on mental and physical health and all information relevant to torture-related psychological consequences .KRCT on a daily basis collects data from our clients' files in order to provide an updated data collection. This activity allows to have an in-depth understanding of our clients' needs and consequently to improve the therapeutic work of the rehabilitation staff. 1587 clients have been registered (reporting period) and the majority of them received long-term treatment from the Centre's multidisciplinary team based on their needs for treatment. Psychological, physical and social rehabilitation of torture and trauma victims is continuing in all KRCT branches (Pristina, Skenderaj/Serbica, Decani, Podujeva, Suhareka, Drenas/ Gllogovc, Klina and Kaçanik). Multidisciplinary teamwork remains the basic principle of rehabilitation. For admission, each client is interviewed by a social worker or a medical doctor. Then the assessment of physical, social and mental symptoms is done by specialists (psychologists or psychiatrists). The prescribed treatment, which includes psychological, medical, social and legal services, is delivered to the beneficiaries on a day - by day basis. Rehabilitation helps torture victims to cope with their traumatic experiences and overcome victimization attitude. When needed, pharmacotherapy and social counselling are offered.

Several psychological treatment methods have been used: Individual Psychotherapy (consultation, support and counselling), Group Psychotherapy, Cognitive Behaviour Therapy, Body Therapy, Family Therapy, Expressive-Creative Therapy and Debriefing.




Figure 2 Somatic disorders



KRCT's part-time Legal Adviser supported 71 clients 188 consolations with legal advice in matters concerning social aid, pensions and employment. Most of the clients applying for social aid or invalidity pension had been refused two or three times before consulting our Legal Adviser. After sometimes lengthy procedures, their rights could be secured.

The Centre's clients belong to a vulnerable group of society with little economic resources. Few of them can afford a lawyer to represent them in court and their access to justice is therefore limited. In order to respond to this need, KRCT adjusted its internal regulations in October 2007 and enabled the Legal Adviser to represent her clients in court. So far, 3 clients have benefited from this new service.

In 2007 KRCT Social Worker in collaboration with" Nena Tarez" local NGO have provided to 91 KRCT clients with poor economical conditions a package with food, hygienic materials clothes and some equipment for dressmaking.
